

Rev. Michael G. Regan

Father Regan is the son of the late John and Margaret (Shea) Regan. He grew up in Dorchester.

He was ordained on February 2, 1962 at the Cathedral by Cardinal Cushing. He offered his first Mass on February 4 at St. Leo Church in Dorchester.

His assignments have included:

Our Lady, Help of Christians, Concord; 1962-1967

Brockton; 1967-1968 Wellesley; 1968-1972

St. Joseph, Malden; 1972-1976; in-residence from 1976-1986 while Serving as chaplain at Pope John XXIII High School, Everett.

Fr. Regan earned a M. Ed. Degree from Boston College in 1971.

On July 15, 1986, he was appointed pastor of St. Thomas Aquinas Parish in Bridgewater. He celebrated his silver jubilee with a Mass of Thanksgiving on Sunday, May 3, 1987. A major event in his pastorate was a major overhaul of the parish center building. The Most Rev. Alfred C. Hughes rededicated the building named the Regan Parish Center on September 13, 1992.

His pastorate ended on December 8, 1996 and he was granted senior priest/retirement status.

His last assignment was to St. Bridget Parish in Abington (1996-2004).

In 2004, he entered Regina Cleri.
