

Harold A. Furblur

Harold was born on June 3, 1936 in Medford, MA to the late Beatrice and Harry Furblur. After graduating high school in 1954, he entered Cardinal O'Connell Seminary in. He continued his studies at St. John's Seminary, and was ordained on February 2, 1962 at Holy Cross Cathedral by Cardinal Cushing.

Harold began a lifetime of service to others as a priest in the Archdiocese of Boston. Later he served in the African Orthodox Church in Roxbury. He moved to the Cape to raise his family in a safe environment, commuting to Roxbury for work. He devoted his life to giving individuals a second chance, working for the Cedar GED program, counseling juvenile offenders and providing care for physically and mentally challenged residents.

Harold was a long time philatelist, an accomplished calligrapher, a tennis player and coach for the Boston International soccer team. He is also well remembered for his leadership as a scout master and was a beloved member of the Cape and Islands Bahá'í Community.

Harold passed away at the Epoch Senior Healthcare Center in Brewster, MA on December 4, 2014 following a prolonged illness. He is survived by his wife, Verlyna, their four sons and daughter. He is remembered by those whose lives he touched in large and small ways with kindnesses which carry large weight when from the heart.
